Five arrested in \$1.6m heist **Officer charged** over cigs theft

A SUSPENDED policeman Cameron Smith was behind bars last night and Katie Lapth after being charged over his alleged involvement in the theft of illegal cigarettes worth \$1.6 million.

Sen-Constable Troy Holmes, who is awaiting a County Court trial for an unrelated matter, is one of five men charged over the theft of 36 pallets of counterfeit cigarettes from Port Melbourne.

An out-of-sessions court hearing was told Sen-Constable Holmes, 30, returned to Melbourne from Sydney when warrants for his arrest were issued by police.

The hearing was told Sen-Constable Holmes was allegedly involved in the cigarette theft with former Australian Federal Police investigator Kevin Dickson, 42, Anthony Purdy, 38, Min Liang, 40 and Jian Weng, 43.

bourne Magistrates' Court earlier yesterday. Det Sgt Wayne Amor, of the Technical Response Unit, said members of the group allegedly deceived staff at a communications company on December 16, 2003.

It is alleged a man told staff he was from the Australian Taxation Office and hired four radios and a satellite phone worth \$8000. They were never returned, the court heard.

The hearing was told that on December 18 a similar incident involving radios worth \$33,000 occurred at Motorola Australia.

Det Sgt Amor said \$1.6 million worth of counterfeit cigarettes was seized by Customs on December 22

in a shipping container. They were placed in storage used by the ATO in Port Melbourne.

It is alleged that on January 20, Mr Purdy produced fake documen-

tation at the storage facility authorising the removal of the cigarettes. The hearing was told he entered

at 5.40am with four truck drivers and removed the cigarettes. Det Sgt Amor said Mr Weng received a large quantity of the cigarettes. He was arrested when he was caught with Mr Dickson at Northland Shopping Centre. Mr Weng allegedly handed Mr Dickson \$138,000 during the meeting.

Magistrate Lisa Hannan bailed Mr Liang, of Maribyrnong, on a \$10,000 surety and Mr Weng, of Glenroy, on a \$75,000 surety.

Mr Dickson, of Box Hill, and Mr Purdy, of Ringwood, did not apply for bail and were remanded in custody. All four men will appear in court again in June.

Last night Bail Justice Derrun Kearns remanded Sen-Constable Holmes in custody to appear again in the Melbourne Magistrates' Court today.

FORMER St Kilda hard man "Rocket" Rod Owen has settled a compensa-tion claim brought by a woman who alleged he assaulted her at his brother's Port Melbourne hotel. Marina De La Roche pocketed \$30,000, plus costs, in an out-of-court settlement.

Ms De La Roche Ms De La Room claimed Mr Owen grabbed her, lifted her up and threw her on to the foot-path outside the Railway Club Hotel in May 1999.
